Subject: Supply Risk Update due to Russia-Ukraine Conflict

As the crisis surrounding the current geopolitical developments related to Ukraine, Russia and Belarus continues, we wanted to reach out and communicate our position. Our priorities remain, as always, to ensure the safety and well-being of our employees, suppliers and communities while continuing to serve our customers.

We do not manufacture any of our products in Ukraine, Russia, or Belarus, and currently, all our manufacturing sites are operational. We are producing based on our current staffing levels, raw material availability, and the latest demand from our customers.

We are in the process of assessing any potential issues, and possible mitigations, that could impact our supply chain and thus our ability to deliver to our customers. This will include:

- TIER1 Supplier and Sub-tier suppliers' location(s) in the potential conflict area(s) affecting operations;
- Effect of potential trade sanctions or trade embargos that would prevent - import, export, financial transfers, etc., from, via or to any of the countries involved; and
- Effect of travel blockades, lane closures, and other disruptions that impact logistics routes (land, sea, air).

We expect to complete this analysis shortly and to the extent there is a material impact on our supply to you, we will be in touch.
